

**2023 Auctions** We have two auctions scheduled for meetings next year. In March we will have our auction to raise funds for a worthwhile local charity. Member will be asked at the December meeting for their thoughts and suggestions on where we might direct the proceeds. The members orchid auction will be held in August.

**New Computer** Committee has approved the purchase of a new computer to replace the one used by the editor. The current machine is again in for repairs and, at around 10 years old, is well past its prime.

**Nursery Closure** The Hanging Garden Nursery is closing at Christmas. They carry a range of different mounts and orchids that can be purchased online.

**2023 Bishops Discount Card** A new Bishops' discount card will be available at the December meeting for members who have paid their 2023 membership. Your 2022 card will be honoured up until the February AGM if you cannot get to the December meeting.

STOP PRESS The South and West Regional Orchid Show is back on the calendar after a COVID hiatus. In 2023 it will be held on the October long weekend (30 September – 1 October, with set up on 29 September) at the Cobargo Showground hosted by the Sapphire Coast Orchid Club with the theme 'Australia in Poetry and Song'. Before COVID, a number of members enjoyed attending previous regional shows and the society entered a display at the last one at Moruya in 2019. Committee has decided to again join 6-7 other orchid societies in 2023 in putting on a 2m x 2m display.

Cobargo is about half an hour north of Bega. There will be catering on site. Members who may be interested in being part of the display team are invited to speak to a committee member.

**Growing Competition December** Can you find you Laelia anceps, Wallbrunn x Laelia anceps Rosminah? You earn a point for just benching it.

**2023 Orchid Shows** The Committee has decided that our three one-day shows will be open to the public from 9.00-4.00 on each Saturday. The dates being: Winter Show Saturday 8th July 9am- 4pm (Set up Friday 7th); Spring Show Saturday 2nd September 9am - 4pm (Set up Friday 1st); October Show Saturday 21st October 9am- 4pm (Set up Friday 20th)

**Best Seedling Competition** During the year members bench any seedling orchids in a special section. These plants are photographed and, at the December meeting, members get the opportunity to vote for the seedling they think was best. What makes a good seedling? The OSNSW judging manual states: A seedling shall be judged as per the Standard applicable for the genus with the following exception; the flower count requirements for the genus shall be waived with allowances being made for the generally smaller first flowering plants. When choosing the one you think is best, try to think what a good example of a mature orchid of each one would look like and select the one that seems to fill the criteria.

## Spotted on the benches in November

Wayne Simmons benched a lovely plant of Dendrobium chrysotoxum. D. chrysotoxum is an epiphytic (lives on other plants) or lithophytic (lives on rocks) member of the orchid family. As with many Dendrobium, the spindle-shaped pseudobulbs are grooved lengthwise from which two or three extended oval leaves will grow. The flower stalk grows out of the tip of the pseudobulb and is covered with up to 20 of the most spectacular flowers. These are yellow, with an orange throat and frilly edge. This is a very showy species that will develop into large multiflowered clumps, so a large pot or basket is needed to contain it.



These plants grow robustly during spring and summer and the growth stops altogether in late autumn, but this species does not shed its leaves during the winter resting period. They need copious water and fertiliser while growing and less when mature. If well grown, it develops in to a very showy large specimen with large multi flowered clumps. The plant can be grown in a pot or basket with lots of water and fertiliser when in active growth. The plant needs a dry period as it approaches winter and the rest primes it for eventual flowering. During this 'rest' period the plant does not need regular water or fertiliser; watering can be done sparingly to ensure that the pseudobulb does not shrivel. The species prefers bright light for good growth and flower production and overall prefers intermediate temperatures.
