The Show Schedule for our **Winter** show is included with the **June** newsletter. Please read the schedule carefully and familiarise yourself with the rules.

Raffle The show raffle is a major fund raiser for our society. Booklets of tickets will be available at the **June** meeting so please try to sell some tickets (\$1.00 each or 6 for \$5.00) and return the money and stubs (sold or unsold) at the Show. There will be three prizes:

1st prize will be two orchids;

2nd prize will be a Family Day Pass to Shoalhaven Zoo;

3rd prize will be \$50 Bunnings card.

Please return all raffle tickets, sold or unsold. The raffle is a way that all members can help contribute to the cost of running our show even if they are limited in being able to help in other ways so please help our Societ out by selling the tickets and returning them.

You do not need to pre-register your entries, but you do need to fill in the Plant Entry form.

Entry Forms Your Entry Form is included with your newsletter. Please have it filled in with your plant names and classes and give it to the Benching Marshal when you have finished benching your plants.

These sheets are used for recording results so please enter plant names accurately and legibly.

Benching on Friday 11th July will take place between 2.00pm and 4.00pm at Bomaderry. Note that 4.00pm is the finishing time. If possible, please bench your plants yourself. This means finding the right class for you plant on the tables. If you are not sure which is the correct class, please ask **Brian Phelan** or another Open grower.

Benching This means finding the right class for your plant on the tables. **Do not move other members** 'plants, please ask the Show Marshal to do this . If you are not sure which is the correct class, please ask Show Marshal. Brian Phelan. or Asst. Show Marshal. Martin Montebello. or an Open grower . You will need to fill in a benching card for each exhibit with the plant name on the front and your name on the back . Place it in front of the pot on the side that you want the plant to face thejudges, i.e., its best aspect. You should also have a name tag concealed in the pot to ensure there is no confusion about ownership at pack -up time. Benching cards will be available at the **June** meeting. These are made from card, not the usual paper ones.

Helpers are required for selling raffle tickets, to provide security for our orchids and to be available to talk to the public. Please consider volunteering a couple of hours of your time to support the society. A roster will be circulated at the **June** meeting to enlist helpers.

Sales Table Members are reminded that the Society's commission on plant sales is 10%. Orchids, ferns and/o foliage plants **only** can be sold. Plants for sale should be healthy , free from pests and/or disease and well established in their pots. Members wishing to sell plants on the sales table must either:

• exhibit some plants in the show, **OR** • be rostered on to work at the show.

Sale of Benched Orchids Members may offer exhibited plants for sale, but these cannot be collected until the end of the show. For sale cards are available from the Sales Table team and members will need to give the Sales Table a list of plants and prices.

Sale of native orchids Members wishing to sell native orchids (species and hybrids) should refer to the NSW Native Orchid Information Guidelines. SOS Native orchid tags are available from the President.

Advertising posters will be distributed at the **June** meeting for display in local shops/noticeboards. Perhaps place one on your car window if it doesn't block your vision. Please help advertise our Show. Email newslette members will be sent one which they are welcome to download.

Trophies A reminder for winners of the Champion trophies at the **2024 Winter Show** to **please return them to the June meeting** cleaned/polished ready to go on the Champions table at the Show if they have not alread been returned.



Orchid Flowers



Parts of the orchid flower

- 1. Dorsal sepal (Note: on paphs and some other orchids the lateral sepals are fused.)
- 2.- 3. Lateral sepals
- 4.- 5. Petals
- 6. Lip or Labellum

If orchid leaves are the 'kitchen' of orchid plants, then the flowers would be the bedroom. Orchids have flowers for one reason – so that they can be pollinated, produce seed and the next generation of orchid plants created. Orchid flowers come in a multitude of shapes, sizes, scents and colours – all cleverly designed to attract a pollinator whose job is to transfer the male pollinia to the female stigma which is then transferred to the ovary and the seed capsules are formed.

The labellum, a modified petal, is usually the biggest and most striking part of the flower with bright colours, spots, stripes, etc. It is a landing platform for the pollinator and the structure of the lip often guides the pollinator to the part of the flower bearing the pollinia which it needs to collect to transfer to the next flower it visits.

Sometimes a genetic mutation causes the petals to mimic the shape, colour and patterning on the labellum. These peloric orchids are becoming quite popular with orchid hobbyists but they would certainly confuse the pollinators. Lynne Phelan
