

SEEDLINGS We have a category for seedlings on our monthly benches and at our shows. An orchid exhibited as a seedling must comprise the *whole plant* grown from seed and being *exhibited and flowering for the first time*.

Unlike mericiones, which are created from pieces of tissue taken from the parent orchid to create new plants which are identical to the parent, seedlings are a genetic lottery and can be vastly different to their pollen and pod parents. When we grow a seedling on we HOPE they will be much better looking than their mum and dad but

we won't know until it flowers and that is why it is so exciting to grow seedlings.

In April this seedlings was benched.

SHOW TIME IS ON ITS WAY!

After two show-less years we may hopefully be able to share our orchids with the public in July. Orchids that will be on the benches will be making their inflorescences. A few tips to ensure they present well:

- Keep the plant in the same aspect to the main light source so that the flowers all 'look' the same way.
- Start staking early to ensure racemes are straight and clear of the foliage.
- Groom your plant and remove all dead leaves and bracts around the pseudobulbs.
- Ensure it is free of creepy crawlies.

Supper is a great time to catch up and talk orchids.

It's not a virus, fungal or bacterial problem. Phew!!



Have you noticed any dendrobiums with these densely speckled leaves? I have several *Den.* Hilda Poxon orchids that have this problem. I searched the internet for leaf spotting using various search terms but could not find anything that looked like this until I came across an Australian Orchid Nursery site which showed the exact same spotting. Here is the explanation:

'This nasty looking spot occurs on a very limited number of [dendrobium] hybrids that have *D. tetragonum* var. *tetragonum* in their background.

It is a genetic fault and can't be cured. It doesn't seem to affect the orchid's health, just its appearance.

Older *Den.* Hilda Poxon [*Den. speciosum x Den. tetragonum*] and *Den.* Ellen [*Den. kingianum x Den. tetragonum*] seem the most prone with 50% D. *tetragonum* in their genetic makeup.

Sometimes the tiny spots are invisible in the background of the leaves but come out when the chlorophyll in the leaves is weakened by frost or

hot sun.'

The Hilda Poxon in the photo was in the shadehouse and had no sign of the spotting until I moved it onto the verandah where it gets the morning sun and very soon the spots appeared. I have no doubt mine are older Hilda Poxon hybrids as they are Neville Roper remakes. Neville began hybridising with Australian native species many years ago. **Lynne Phelan**
