Then they go into a 60L plastic garbage bin (that I keep just for this purpose) which has a mixture of water and bleach. Left for a day or so, remove pots and dry in sun and they are ready for use.

AROUNG THE SHADEHOUSE with Stuart Crowther

(Reprint from our newsletter in July 2009)

Over the last few years in our society we have experienced a rapid increase in the group of orchids known as the Oncidium Alliance and as such we now have three sections in our show schedule. There will be no doubt that in our winter show these sections will again be well up in entries. I have been looking up my records in the hope that I could give members a list of the parentage of these orchids, however it covers 2 pages and this would be better printed out for those who wish to have the information as a reference. However here is a list of twelve of the common types you may see on the show bench.

- 1. Aliceara. (Alcra.) = Brassia x Miltonia x Oncidium
- 2. Beallara (Bllra.) = Brassia x Cochloida x Miltonia x Odontoglossum
- 3. Brassidium (Brsdm.) = Brassia x Oncidium
- 4. Burrageara (Burr.) = Cochlioda x Miltonia x Odontoglossum x Oncidium
- 5. Colmanara (Colm.) = Miltonia x Odontoglossum x Oncidium
- 6. Degarmoara (Dgmra) = Brassia x Miltonia x Odontoglossum
- 7. Howeara (Hwra.) = Leochilus x Oncidium x Rodriguezia
- 8. Maclellanara (McIna.) = Brassia x Odontoglossum x Oncidium
- 9. Miltassia (Mtssa) = Brassia x Miltonia
- 10. Odontocidium (Ocdm.) = Odontoglossum x Oncidium
- 11. Vuylstekeara (Vuyl.) = Cochlioda x Miltonia x Odontoglossum
- 12. Wilsonara (Wyls.) = Cochlioda x Odontoglossum x Oncidium

For those wishing to add some of these to your collection here are some cultural notes which can help you along the way.

These orchids are generally classed as intermediate to warm growing and as such are suitable for growing in the Shoalhaven district. Some research into the parentage should give you an indication as to whether they require slightly warmer condition in summer and vice versa. Most of the orchids will require bright light conditions if they are to flower well and by changing the position of the plants in your shadehouse you should be easily able to place the plants in their optimum growing position. Those plants with Brassia in their parentage will appreciate more light.

Potting and Potting Mixes - I have had reasonable success in growing these plants in Coco-chip and also a mix of bark and stone. Many growers use Sphagnum Moss which is sometimes mixed with granulated styrene foam. Whatever mix you use it should satisfy the following requirements:

- 1. Be reasonably cheap and easily obtained.
- 2. Well drained and has good lasting qualities.
- 3. Be of suitable size for the plant and the pot used.

These plants like a humid climate with around 50% to 60% for optimum growth and the potting mix should not be allowed to dry out completely between waterings but be kept just moist. Of course, the plants will need more water on hot days and when the air movement around the plant is increased with windy conditions. I fertilize my plants twice a week with 1/4 strength fertilizer using low nitrogen fertilizer for flowering size plants and high nitrogen for small plants. As far as disease control goes, I have found that black spot is the major problem. Possibly the worst plants I have in my collection for this problem are Oncidium Sharry Baby 'Sweet Fragrance', both the red flowering and yellow flowering types. Repeated spraying with fungicide and good air movement is a must.

If you see a nice plant on the show bench record its name and the owner of the plant. They may have a division which they may sell you or be able to suggest a nursery where it may be purchased. They are very rewarding and reasonably easy plants to grow some crosses may flower two or three time a year but make sure that the spikes are trained up into position as they grow so the flowers will be well presented

If you are an ardent viewer of the ABC Gardening Australia program on Saturday night like I am you will often see some really good gardening tips, one which interested me greatly was mixing your own oil to spray your plants against scale insects. Organic Spray—a mixture of 2 cups vegetable oil and 1/2 a cup of washing up liquid and diluted at a rate of 20mls/litre of water.



Did You Know?

In 1890 Frederick Sander ordered orchid hunter William Micholitz to New Guinea in search of a variety of

Dendrobium phalaenopsis (then known as Den. schroderianum, now known as Den. bigibbum) which was very coveted at the time. After suffering many difficulties, he found himself a guest in a native village and was invited to watch a war dance. After a while, he became bored and while walking about, stumbled across some ritual sacrifices. Feeling horrified and sick, he rushed towards the jungle where perched on the boughs of trees, Den. phalaenopsis was rediscovered. Large quantities were removed and readied for shipment to England. While en route, fire broke out on the ship and the precious cargo was lost.

Ordered back to find more plants, Micholitz grudgingly returned to New Guinea and in June of the following year on some rocks in a small village he once again found plants growing on bare limestone between a large number of human skulls and bones. After bribing the reluctant natives with trinkets, he had brought from England for this purpose, every plant in the area was collected. Despite his promise to Sander to not send any bones or skulls with his precious cargo, one plant attached to a skull arrived in England where it created quite a sensation when it was put up for auction.
