## Winter Show Report

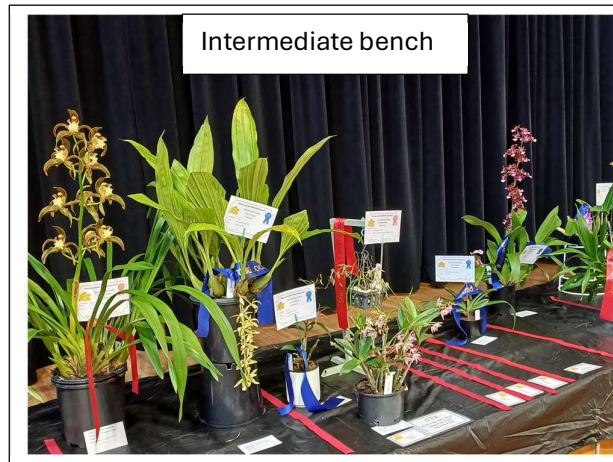
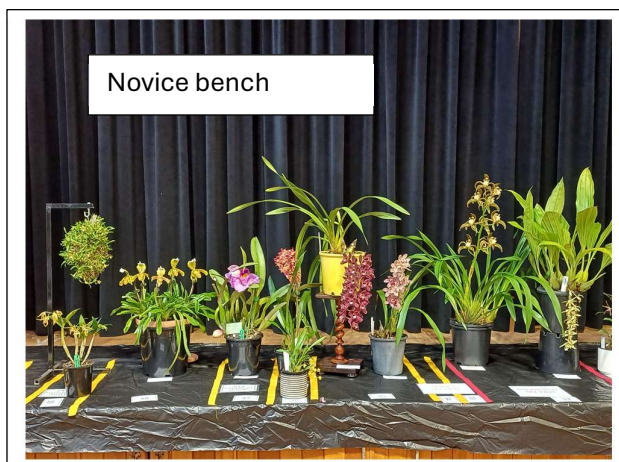

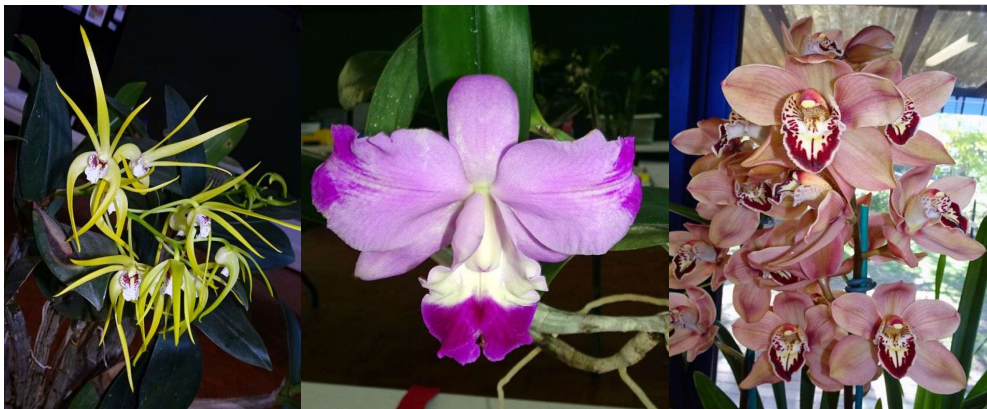

# ORCHID AWARDS

Orchid judging is done in accordance with the Australian Orchid Council Judging Rules.

To be eligible for an award the plant must have been grown by the applicant(s) for a minimum of two years and the judging panel will require reasonable evidence to that effect.

<b>FCC</b>	First Class Certificate	85 points or more of possible 100	These are <b>plant</b> Quality Awards. A panel of at least 5 judges is required to make an award. The award attaches to the plant so any vegetative division or mericloned offspring will carry the award.
<b>AM</b>	Award of Merit	80 to 85 points	
<b>HCC</b>	Highly Commended Certificate	75 to 80 points	
<b>AD</b>	Award of Distinction	An AD is awarded for distinctive attributes e.g. colour	
<b>CBM</b>	Certificate of Botanical Merit	To obtain a CBM the plant must be a species or natural hybrid that is rare or unusual in cultivation.	
<b>ACE</b>	Award of Cultural Excellence	85 points or more of possible 100	These are Cultural Awards that go to the <b>grower</b> for a particularly well-grown plant. The award does not attach to any divisions or any mericloned offspring derived from the plant.
<b>ACM</b>	Award of Cultural Merit	80 to 85 points	
<b>ACC</b>	Award of Cultural Commendation	75 to 80 points	
<b>ASR</b>	Award of Special Recognition	An ASR may be granted for a significant breeding achievement, producing a crossing of outstanding consistent quality. To qualify for this type of ASR the breeder should present a minimum of twelve (12) plants of one hybrid or line bred species, flowering at the time of judging.
