CHANGES TO THE CONSTITUTION

As announced at the November meeting, the document circulated with the last newsletter containing the proposed changes to the constitution was incomplete. The revised changes are being sent along with this newsletter for consideration at the December meeting. In accordance with our existing constitution, changes may only be made with the endorsement of two-thirds majority of eligible members present and voting at a general meeting. The committee's proposed changes will be explained and members asked to vote their acceptance at the December General Meeting.

SOCIETY BY-LAWS

Committee has made a slight amendment to the Society's by-laws to increase the flexibility of timing for visiting speakers. Clause 2.3 currently states:

2.3 - A twenty minute supper break will be held after the guest speaker and before the continuance of the meeting to enable members to view the winning plants for the night.

The phrase *after the guest speaker and before the continuance of the meeting* has been deleted so the guest speaker may choose when they would like to do their presentation.

2021 ORCHID SHOWS

The Committee has been advised by the Bomaderry Bowling Club that, should the function rooms be available for shows in 2021, significant hire charges will be levied. This would amount to around \$3,000 for the three shows. Committee has decided that this is not a viable option for us. After discussing alternatives it has been decided that the shows will be held at our regular meeting venue, the Bomaderry Community Centre. Because the Centre is not available on a Sunday there will be three one-day shows with set up and judging on Friday and the show open to the public on Saturday.

The Community Centre Management has advised us that we will be able to hold three one-day shows there in 2021 with the dates being: Winter Show 10th July with set-up on 9th July; Spring Show on 4th September (set-up 3rd September) and October Show on 23rd October (set-up on 22nd).

MONDAY 16th NOVEMBER 2020
HELD AT BOMADERRY COMMUNITY CENTRE

Meeting opened 7.30pm.

President, Louise Gannon welcomed all members, visitors and a special warm welcome to Jane and Peter D'Olier our guest speakers, tonight talking on Orchids of Papua New Guinea. Louise also reminded everyone to be sure that they have signed the Covid attendance sheet and our Society Attendance Book, maintain social distancing and use hand sanitiser supplied where appropriate.

Apologies: Robyn Gunter, Suzanne Knight and Yvonne Young

Attendance: 31 Members Visitors: 2

Acceptance of Minutes for the October meeting as printed in the November Newsletter were correct:

Moved J. Clancy. 2nd T. Bourke that Minutes be accepted

Correspondence: As Read. Moved F. Sikora. 2nd R. Findlater that correspondence be accepted.

Treasurers Report: As Read. Moved D. Slye. 2nd J. Clarke that Treasurer's report be accepted.

The Committee Report, Treasurer's Report and Correspondence are all up on the easel for members to view. Also, a certificate from Ronald McDonald House in appreciation of the Society donation.

W.H.S. Report: Sandra commented that while the First Aid Officer was not attending meeting that she had the First Aid Kit and let everyone know the location of the kit during meetings.

Novice Corner: Ron Findlater took Novice Corner talking on soft canes dendrobiums. Ron handed out some literature on soft canes and everyone walked away a little wiser. Thank you, Ron.

New Members: Noelene Weatherby and Rhonda Ditchburn were called upon to receive their Welcome packs and plants as they were away for last months meeting. Congratulations.

Louise reminded everyone that tonight is the last night for benching points for this year 2020.

Two members have been elevated. Congratulations to Gary Jonas who has joined his first Society after growing orchids for more than 30 years and was initially placed in intermediate, after his first benching last month he has been elevated to open class. Congratulations to Francoise Sikora elevated from novice to intermediate class. Both received Certificates of Congratulations and both will bench in their new class from the December meeting.

The proposed changes to the constitution that were to be presented to members tonight have been pushed back to the December meeting. One of the proposed changes was missing from the information already sent to members. As there is a mandatory 7-day notice to members for all changes, these will be resent and then voted on at the December meeting.

Committee has decided to make an amendment to one of our By-Laws in regards to monthly meetings. 2.3. states "A

twenty minute supper break shall be held after the guest speaker and before the continuance of the meeting to enable members to view the winning plants for the night", this has been changed to "A twenty minute supper break will be held". This will allow flexibility for the Guest Speaker to present before or after supper, whilst also allowing members that are counting the benching votes not to miss the presentation.

Our three shows next year will not be held at Bomaderry Bowling Club, after our request to have our room hire fees waived was rejected even though we believed our shows brought them much business. The cost would come to approx. \$1000 for our two day shows and approx. \$760 for our one day show. These fees were not sustainable for our society. Alternatively, we have booked Bomaderry Community Centre for three one day shows in 2021, which allows for set up and judging on Friday afternoons/evenings and from 8am to 6pm on Saturdays. The cost for both days is approx. \$283 per show, which is considerably less. Whilst we enjoyed our time at BBC and hosting our shows there, we are no longer affiliated with Bomaderry Bowling Club.

Our recent Bunnings BBQ at the new store was a great success, raising \$1392.13 net profit. With Covid restrictions it made for an interesting and very busy day. A big THANK YOU to Yvonne and Captain Sandra for organising the day and another thank you to Captain Sandra for manning the ship all day. Thankyou to all the helpers, Teresa, Louise, Brian Phelan, Francoise, Diane, John Clancy, John Clarke, Brian Shelvey, Ron, Richard and Phil for volunteering on the day.

Don Hogan recently purchased a number of gongoras and stanhopeas on behalf of the society which are mainly species that are not often seen. These are available on the sales table with a limit of one of each to members. Thank you, Don, for your efforts.

Don kindly showed us around his orchids. The photo I have attached is of Don's growing area across the back of his yard. Shadecloth covers only the top, leaving the front and sides open. Don grows a variety of orchids here including, cymbidium, oncidiums, sarcophilus, dendrobiums and paphiopedilums. Don also has a number of different stanhoepas which all had very large healthy green leaves.

This growing area receives the very welcome morning sun while the afternoon sun is blocked by a neighbour's tall trees. Another growing area is suited to growing cattleyas. Don certainly has green fingers with both his orchids and gardening plants all growing very well.
