#### SPOTTED ON THE BENCHES IN FEBRUARY

Two of Lawrence Watkins orchids caught my eye last month.

**Bulbophyllum odoratissimum** This unusual orchid is distributed from India down through Southeast Asia. The capitate\* inflorescence carries many flowers. It grows in a subtropical biome and tolerates quite a wide temperature range so can be grown cool to warm. In nature, it grows on trees (epiphytic) but mostly on mossy rocks (lithophytic), the pseudobulbs spreading out and covering a wide area. Unlike many bulbophyllums, this one has a very pleasant fragrance. \* Capitate - A closely packed head of flowers that do not have flower stalks.

Vanda tricolor This lovely orchid is endemic to Java. It grows both epiphytically and lithophytically (on trees or rocks) or sometimes even terrestrially (in the ground). Vandas are either strap leafed (flat) or terete (round or pencil shaped). V. tricolor is the strap leafed type which are less tolerant to full sunlight. They are intermediate to warm growers and like plenty of air movement and high humidity in summer and autumn with plenty of water during the growing season. Reduce watering in winter months.

NOTE Vandas are monopodial orchids, i.e. they grow continuously from the apex of the stem; they don't make new pseudobulbs which can be divided off. It is often very difficult to propagate them as many are reluctant to produce side shoots which can be removed to make a new plant. In an early work by J. N. Rentoul, *Growing Orchids Book 3 Vandas, dendrobiums and others,* (pages 18 and 19 in my edition) he describes and illustrates a method of putting a cut in the stem to encourage a plantlet to grow in the vicinity of the cut. Once this keiki develops roots it can removed and you have a division of the 'mother' plant. The positioning of this cut is critical as there must be roots growing both above and below the cut. 
