Thankyou members who worked on the Bunnings BBQ recently. It was a full-on day, selling all our 50kgs of sausages, 42 loaves of bread and 22 kgs of onions. ### Licence to sell NSW Australian Native Orchids

Our Society has been granted a licence by the Dept. of Environment and Heritage to sell NSW Australian Native Orchids at our shows with some associated conditions –

One of the conditions is that we maintain proper records of the NSW native plants that we sell. The other, is that each plant must be properly tagged.

### 1. RECORD SHEET FOR THE SALE OF AUSTRALIAN NSW NATIVE ORCHIDS

If you wish to sell any NSW native species or hybrid orchids at our shows, you need to complete the attached sheet, listing the plants that you are selling (which are NSW native species or hybrid orchids). For NSW native hybrids, the species parents need also to be listed. For example, for Dendrobium Bardo Rose, you would show this hybrid name with 'Den. falcorostrum x Den. kingianum' on your sheet. Put a tick in the appropriate box for either species or hybrid for each plant on your list and write the sales price for each plant on your list. Bring this completed sheet with you to the Sales Bench area of our Show.

(Other non-NSW native species or hybrids DO NOT need to be included on this sheet.)

### 2. LABELLING

The second condition relates to appropriate labelling of Aust. NSW Native Orchids which are sold under the Licence of Shoalhaven Orchid Society Inc.

Appropriate tags must be in the pot of each NSW native species or hybrid plant which are sold at our shows. Each plant tag must say -Shoalhaven Orchid Society Inc., and Plantation Grown. (Our Society has purchased tags with the wording already typed on them. Available from the Sales Table). The two words 'Plantation Grown' are critical to fulfilling the conditions of our license.

<u>Please write the orchid's name on the back of the tag.</u> Hybrid orchid plants for sale need to have the word 'hybrid' and will also need to note the species parents on the tag. Please make sure the corresponding number on the record sheet matches the number on the Plantation Grown plant tag.

If you are not sure of the parentage, leave that part blank and ask for help when you get to the show with your plants. Please report to one of the Committee Members at the Sales Table when you arrive because your native plants <u>MUST</u> be checked in before they are allowed on the sales table.

An Item of interest -

'As native orchids may have been hybridised multiple times and the exact parent species are no longer known, OEH will accept tags with the hybrid names at the genus level eg. 'Dendrobium species – Hybrid plant'. Where available, a full descriptive label of parentage should be provided.'

<u>PLEASE NOTE:</u> Plants cannot be offered for sale bare-rooted, or attached to an endemic growing medium. Selling plants on lengths of branch or other substrate which can clearly be identified as collected from the wild, is prohibited.

There are severe consequences for those who do not co-operate with the legislation.

## **SPRING HAS SPRUNG**

Each season comes with its own orchid chores and spring is one of the busiest seasons for orchid growers.

This is the main season for repotting orchids that bloomed in autumn, winter and early spring. For example, autumn flowering cattleyas, cymbidiums and dendrobiums which have finished flowering and outgrown their pots or their potting mix has degraded need to be moved into bigger pots and/or fresh potting media. As you repot, remove any dead flower sheaths and leaf bracts as these can hide scale infestations or trap moisture and lead to rotting.

Spring heralds a growth spurt after flowering. The new growth will increase nutrient consumption by your orchids so be sure to adjust your fertilizer regime to meet this demand. Because they are in growth mode, new roots will quickly establish in fresh potting media.

As the days warm up you may need to increase the frequency of watering, especially if it is very windy. Watch for insect pests. The warmth of spring is not only good for your orchids, but for hungry suckers such as scale and mealybugs. Check your plants often and deal with infestations before they become well established.

You may need to reposition your orchids as the sun moves around so that those that are in full growth get plenty of light (but not sunburnt) and those that are resting or less active can move to a more shaded position.

Your sarcochilus should be in full spike getting ready for the October orchid show so give these plenty of attention but once they have finished flowering let them have a short dryer rest. I move mine to the south side of the shade house until after the new year and repot them in autumn.

*The Show Schedule* for our **October** show is included with the **October** newsletter. Please read the schedule carefully and familiarise yourself with the rules.

**Raffle** The show raffle is a major fund raiser for our society. There will be three prizes:

1<sup>st</sup> prize will be two orchids;

2<sup>nd</sup> prize will be a Family Day Pass to Shoalhaven Zoo;

3<sup>rd</sup> prize will be \$50 Bunnings card.

You do not need to pre-register your entries, but you do need to fill in the Plant Entry form.

Entry Forms Your Entry Form is included with your newsletter. Please have it filled with your plant names and classes and give it to the Benching Marshal when you have finished benching your plants. These sheets are used for recording results so please enter plant names accurately and legibly.

Benching on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> October will take place between 2.00pm and 4.00pm at Bomaderry. Note that 4.00pm is the finishing time.

Benching NEW CONDITIONS: PLEASE READ CAREFULLY When you arrive, please see the benching marshals, Brian or Martin, BEFORE you bench your plants. The benching marshals will tell you when it is time for you to bench your plants. A staging area will be available for members who need to leave before their plants can be benched. The marshals will bench them for you. Make sure you leave your benching cards with your plants. Under no circumstances should you move other member's plant. If there is not enough space for your plant, please ask a Show Marshal for help. If you are not sure which is the correct class, ask the show marshals or an Open grower. You will need to fill in a benching card for each exhibit with the plant name on the front and your name on the back. Place it in front of the pot on the side you want the plant to face the judges, i.e., its best aspect. You should also have a name tag concealed in the pot to ensure there is no confusion about ownership at pack-up time.

Helpers are required for selling raffle tickets, to provide security for our orchids and to be available to talk to the public. Please consider volunteering a couple of hours of your time to support the society. *Sales Table* Members are reminded that the Society's commission on plant sales is 10%. Orchids, ferns and/or foliage plants **only** can be sold. Plants for sale should be healthy, free from pests and/or disease and well established in their pots. Members wishing to sell plants on the sales table must either:

• exhibit some plants in the show, **OR** • be rostered on to work at the show.
